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1. COVID-19


COVID-19 will stand alone I suspect as the most prominent moment in the first twenty five years of this century. The sudden appearance of the Pandemic and its rapid movement around the world will change how we live our life I expect. At 75 I am at the other end of my life but as a child growing up in the 1950s older relatives still mentioned The Spanish Flu remembering with sadness those who had perished. But I have lived the first 74 years of my life without any major sort of catastrophe except for 9/11 which mostly affected the United States but because of the air space being closed over the United States we landed the planes which had passed the point of no return coming from across the Pacific and across the Atlantic. For us, Canada, this was a major accomplishment given that we do not have any large cities on the Eastern Seaboard and old airfields not used in quite a while were brought into play to bring those people on the planes to safety. Mostly American citizens, they were forced to wait here in Canada for another week until their border was opened once again. In the folklore of the east coast this will be a time that is remembered in song for a long time. The warmth of our easterners is well known and they proceeded to make the passengers feel wanted and cared about during their time there. My life changed during this present time of COVID-19 in that my

husband had a life-threatening event during the midst of the lockdown which required a hospital stay of eight days and he continues to recover at home. Taking on all the jobs around the home, my genealogy suffered and I now have four newsletters to produce including one Blake Newsletter for the 1st of July 2020.

2. Blake Pedigree Chart - Blake Museum at Bridgwater, Somerset and these charts are on their website (note the new location of this particular set of charts): https://www.bridgwatermuseum.org.uk/museum-collections/blake-family-tree.htm

The Blake Museum has given me permission to put these charts in the newsletter and will look at Blake Pedigree Chart 9 in this Newsletter. This chart is referring to the Blake family found in Gloucestershire partially. This Blake family descendant of the marriage of Robert Blake and Avice (Wallop) late is well documented with a number of wills that I have already transcribed and can be found on my blog (http://kippeeb.blogspot.com). I will insert and refer to several of them in this section.

Chart 9 can be seen below on the next page. There is a blue circle on that chart and this individual, John Blake, is probably one of the most interesting of the descendants of Robert Blake and Avice Wallop. He is still living at the time of his mother's death and appears on the Post-mortem Inquisition created with regard to her estate. His age is said to be 40 years or more which gives a time frame within this Blake family. Difficult to acquire in the 1400s is a guage of age that can be utilized when talking about a family. John Blake, himself, left his will and it is clearly the same John but his will has left a substantial hole in our knowledge of the descendancy of this John Blake. He does not mention a male descendant bearing his surname but various charts do give such a descendant. It was often the case that the male children and especially the eldest were settled on land and already in possession of their inheritance at the time of the death of their father. Sometimes no mention was made of these settled children but other times they would be mentioned with a small legacy.

In this crop from the chart above, you can clearly see that this is John Blake of Nether Wallop, Hampshire born circa 1430 (Aged 40 or more 20 Oct 1476 (the date of his mother's post mortem inquisition) and died 2 Mar 1503/4 with his own Inquisition Post Mortem dated 16 Oct 1506.

From British History Online, Inquisitions Post Mortem, Henry VII, entries 801-850 (pages 425-445) is found a copy of the transcription of John Blake's post mortem inquisition (https://www.british-history.ac.uk/inquis-post-mortem/series2-vol3/pp425-445):

823. JOHN BLAKE.

Inquisition, virtute officii, 16 October, 22 Henry VII.

He was seised in fee of the under-mentioned 2 messuages and watermill in Calne and capital messuage in Compton Basset, and by his charter dated 16 October, 16 Henry VII, enfeoffed thereof Richard Beauchamp, knight, lord de St. Amand, John Michell and Alexander Blake, to hold to them and their heirs to the use of himself and his heirs and for the performance of his last will; and the said feoffees were seised thereof accordingly.

He was seised in fee of the under-mentioned 200a. pasture in Stoke and Stokeley and 7 burgage tenements in Calne, and by his charter enfeoffed thereof Robert Blake, Richard Colnet, William Aleyn and Robert Wayte, to hold to them and their heirs to the use of himself and his heirs and for the performance of his last will; and they were seised thereof accordingly.

By his last will he directed that after his death John Dauntesey should have for life a moiety of the premises in Stoke and Stokeley, and of the 7 burgage tenements in Calne, with successive remainders to Richard Dauntesey, son of the said John Dauntesey and of Alice his wife, daughter of the testator, and the heirs of the body of Richard, to Joan Wroughton, the other daughter of the testator, and the heirs of her body, and to the right heirs of Robert Blake, the testator's brother, and that the said Joan should have the other moiety of the premises to her and the heirs of her body, with successive remainders to the said

Richard Dauntesey and the heirs of his body, and to the right heirs of the said Robert Blake. He also directed that the above feoffees of the 2 messuages and watermill in Calne and capital messuage in Compton Basset should stand seised thereof to the intent that they should allow the executors of his will to take all the issues and profits thereof until all his debts, legacies and funeral expenses should have been paid, and until 10 marks should have been paid for the salary of a priest celebrating for one year for the souls of himself and his friends and all the faithful departed, and that afterwards they should stand seised of one moiety thereof to the use of the said John Dauntesey for life, with successive remainders to the said Richard Dauntesey and the heirs of his body, to the said Joan Wroughton and the heirs of her body, and to the right heirs of the said Robert Blake, and of the other moiety thereof to the use of the said Joan Wroughton and the heirs of her body, with successive remainders to Richard Dauntesey and the heirs of his body, and to the right heirs of the said Robert Blake. The said John Dauntsey is dead.

John Blake died 14 March, 19 Henry VII. Joan wife of Robert Wroughton, his daughter, aged 30 years and more, and Richard Dauntsey, son of Alice his other daughter, aged 7 years and more, are his heirs.


Wilts:

2 messuages, a watermill and 7 burgage tenements in Calne, worth 100s., held of the king in burgage.

200a. pasture in Stoke and Stokeley, worth 40s., held of the lord de St. Amand, as of his manor of Stoke, in socage, by a rent of 1 lb. pepper yearly.

A capital messuage in Compton Basset, held of the king, as of his manor of Compton Basset, parcel of his earldom of York (sic), by knight-service.

His will was dated 24 Jan 1303/4 and probated 24 April 1504. He is said to have been married twice; his first marriage to Margery Dyncham and his second marriage to Margery Dauntesey and she was a widow.



On the Wiltshire Visitation of 1623 John is listed last so was perhaps the youngest child.




At this point I will add in a crop of the Blake Pedigree Chart held at the Wiltshire and Swindon Record Office (Reference Number 343/1MS) (this chart can be purchased from the Wiltshire and Swindon Record Office as eight images).





Only one marriage is mentioned for John Blake on this chart, marriage to Margery Dyncham/Dinham/Denham and only one son is mentioned David married to Joane Mallet (more discussion to follow on the children of this couple).

The Blake Family Chart held by the Blake Museum and images set in above and here:



There are no children from the second marriage; the information found below belongs to another family further to the right on the chart. Children of the first marriage (John Blake and Margery Dyncham) are listed as Alice Blake married to John Dauntesey, Isabel Blake who was mentioned in her husband's Will and Jane Blake who married Thomas Wroughton. Alice and John Dauntesey had one son Richard Dauntesey mentioned in the will above.

The differences between these two charts is extremely important. The Chart held by the Swindon and Wiltshire Record Office was created in 1690 with additions up into the 1700s by the College of Arms, London. The additions can not be seen as different from the rest of the Chart although the dating does assist in that regard. The handwriting of the earlier work appears to be the same, the style of recording appears to be the same. The Blake Family Chart held at the Blake Museum may have been created in the mid 1800s is my thought but it is unknown at this time who created this chart. It has similarities to the Chart produced by the College of Arms in the earliest notations but also differences right at the beginning. Both Charts have known errors in that earliest notation on the "founder" of this Blake line. John Blake's will verifies his heir Richard Dauntsey without telling that she is the son of his daughter Alice married to John Dauntesey. John Dauntesey, because his mother married John Blake when he was widowed, became John Blake's stepson as well as his son in law. His daughter Alice was not mentioned so was likely deceased as mentioned in the Blake Museum Blake Family Chart.

Looking again at the Chart created by the College of Arms (at an earlier date) David son of John Blake and Margarey Dyncham is given the coat of arms of his father which include a half moon depicting a younger son which John was. Now looking at the children of David Blake and Joane Mallet namely John Blake, Lord Abbot of Cirencester in Gloucestershire and William Blake of Lacock who married Margaret Browne. Again the coat of arms of William includes the same half moon as that of his father. This couple is said to have had two children Martin Blake of Winchcomb, Gloucestershire married to Catherine Vaughan and John for whom the only information is that he was the ancestor of Lord Admiral Robert Blake of Bridgwater, Somerset. No will has been found for David Blake or his wife Joane (Mallet) Blake. As I mention earlier I am only looking at these two charts and recording what I see and the associated documents that help to prove these charts. That David is not listed in the will of John Blake is not unusual. Other Blake wills of this family in particular have only mentioned the children they needed to mention for a specific reason. Not having him listed does not eliminate him as a son of John Blake and Margery Dyncham. Not listing the daughters of John and Margery Blake on the one chart is also not surprising given that this is almost two hundred years later. The lands that had belonged to John Blake and listed in his will passed to his grandson Richard Dauntesey and continued in the Dauntesey line as far as I know. I have not looked beyond Richard Dauntesey as I am only interested in the Blake surname for this one-name

study. If you move away from an area (which David Blake obviously did) then information on your close relatives does get lost through the generations. I have proof of that in my own family lines. Three of my grandparents were born and raised in England. My father, and his parents earlier, did keep in touch with his relatives into the 1970s but my grandmother never maintained any sort of correspondence with her parent's siblings. Everything I learned about her parent's or her parent's siblings was from the records. I have linked with a few of her cousins with DNA but any knowledge of that line has been lost in terms of day to day knowledge that wasn't passed to me by my grandmother. That is the early 2000s one can only imagine how much was lost in the 1500s!

The information contained on these two charts is quite exciting in terms of the Blake family. Thus far there has not been a tester with a proven line back to the Calne Blake family or the Bridgwater Blake family in the yDNA study. There are probably a lot of people who live in England who descend from these two lines. Certainly the dream of the founder of the Blake yDNA study was to discover the DNA signature of these two families in particular. I did not originate the study; I joined it with my brother's result in 2007 and to this day I do not have any matches with my brothers' DNA (I have now tested two of them). I do know that it is an ancient line in the British Isles dating back likely 8000 years or more. My grandfather always said that his Blake line was from the area in which he lived which was Upper Clatford. He also knew that his ancient ancestor Nicholas Blake had lived at Old Hall and during his childhood the family would make a regular trek to that particular place which was, by then, a pile of rubble but it was "home" so to speak and as he aged he grew to appreciate that his father had felt it was necessary for his children to know that this was their roots; this place called Old Hall which Nicholas in his will of 1547 referred to as such. The way back in my lines is very clear to the time of the Restoration. Then it appears to be clear back to Nicholas Blake and then his father Richard who left his will in 1522 and his grandfather Robert who left his will in 1521. That takes us back to the mid 1400s and the Manor Books for Andover list Blake back into the early 1300s. I am confident that my own line is not descendant of the Calne Blake line or the Somerset Blake line at least in that direct male line. The marriage of Richard Blake and Jone Blake in the early 1580s may have brought that the Calne Blake line into this Blake line from which I am descended. Certainly there are Visitation Records for Wiltshire and Hampshire that demonstrate that thought.

But what remains to be done, is to find people willing to test the vDNA Blake line to see if there can be a clear establishment of this line that was found in Wiltshire and Somersetshire back into the 1400s.

3. Blake Surname Study - Progress Still in the process of redoing the classification of the kits.

Blake Autosomal Study at FT DNA (Family Finder)

Useful on an individual basis but I can not report on matching as that would interfere in the privacy of the individual members. In some cases these are large matches and in other cases relatively small but that is the way with the inheritance of autosomal DNA. With each generation chunks of autosomal DNA can either be broken into smaller units or passed as a large chunk relatively intact. It is a purely random event. Due to privacy concerns it is not possible to produce a chart of the members who do have matches with other members of the group but each member is able to check that for themselves in their account. What would be helpful is adding a family tree to your account thus making it much more possible to find matching autosomal DNA cousins in your research.

4. Andover, Hampshire, England, Parish Registers

Andover, Hampshire, England has often been said to be the "home of the Blakes" when I have been writing to people in Hampshire through the years. I would say that Calne, Wiltshire perhaps has a stronger hold on that particular title although there are a number of other areas in England where the Blake family has been for centuries. When I decided to transcribe the Parish Registers of Andover I was surprised to find that yes there are a number of Blake entries but there are far more Blake entries in Parish Registers in other parts of England as mentioned. In this issue, I will publish the baptisms for Blake in the Parish Registers. These records are taken from fiche which have scans of the original parish registers. The registers for baptisms begin in 1588 and have provided me with a lot of details on the Blake family in Andover in the late 1500s and into the 1600s/1700s. Eventually I hope to complete my project of transcribing these Parish Registers for St Marys Andover beyond the early to mid 1700s.

Baptismal Registers commenced in 1588 and I will start publishing these transcriptions for Andover.
