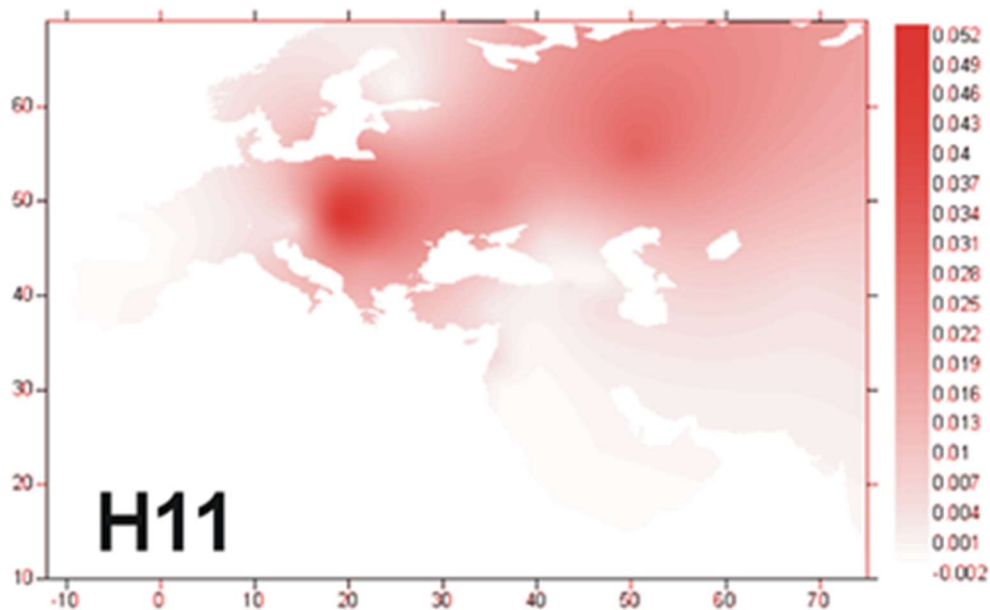
**Since this study represents a small portion of the total number of H11 people tested at FT DNA I do think that the haplotree in each individual project does supply quite a bit of information (referring**

**This heat map for H11 was rather interesting:**

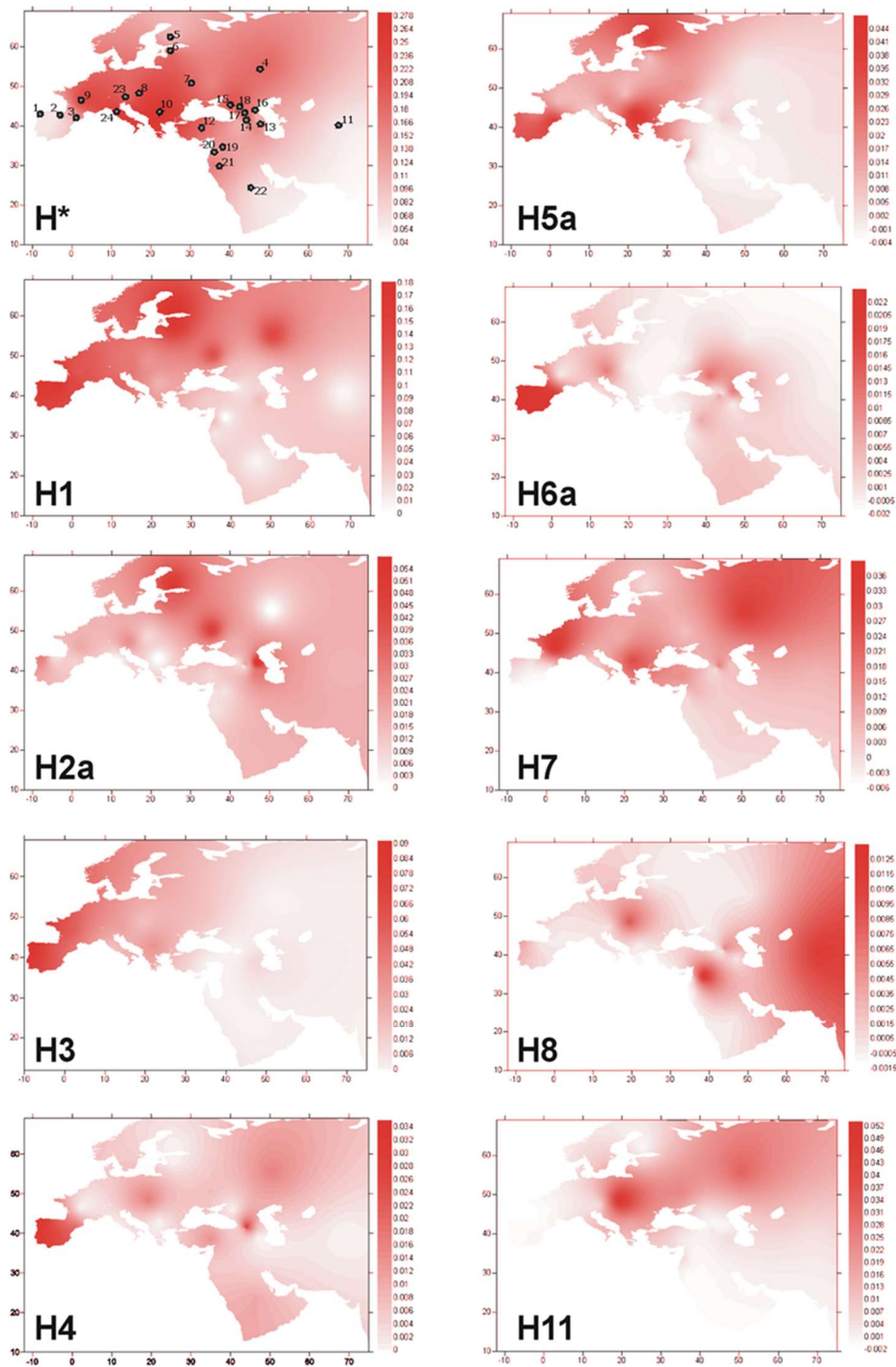

**Since the Blood of the Isles (Professor Bryan Sykes) database includes my particular set of mutations but it is a relatively small group in the British Isles, the ancient female ancestor in this line traveled a very long way to arrive in the Ayrshire/Argyllshire area of present day Scotland.
