#### 1. The Kip-Kipp Family Newsletter

This issue will discuss the eldest daughter of Hendrick Hendricksen Kip and Tryntie Lubberts. Generally in a one name study the daughters drop out after they marry and but Edward has carried these lines forward as well.

#### 2. Edward Kipp, HBSc, PhD, MLS

It is just over two years now since Edward passed away. My daughters are still grieving him; the one because she spent so much time with him over the course of each year and the other because she wanted him to be there with her sons to show them all the wonderful things that he had shown to her. They will gradually take on all of those interesting times and make them their own weaving his memory into the types of things they shared and that is the process now. I think that it is hard to let parents go perhaps but the bonding between them was very strong and it will take a while before they are past grieving and just celebrate the life that he gave to them and follow in his footsteps.

The two years has made it so much more distant now since we sat at coffee breaks during our research activities (we met most days) and the memories become dimmer for me perhaps it is also my age as I am going to be 78 in the fall. Edward did genealogy differently from my surname studies. We each have our own methodology and sadly I am finding it harder and harder to manage his studies in as much as I have. This summer I shall start to look for people to take over material for his different lines. I have had interesting conversations with a Kipp descendant (and most of the older pictures are from that set of children of their mutual great grandfather Benjamin Kipp so an ideal person to manage this collection if I am able to persuade her). The Allen family (his maternal grandmother also has active researchers whom I will contact). The Link family material I have passed on to one of his cousins although will keep an eye out for anything that pertains to that family. Their grandfather married twice and the second marriage has far more descendants than the first (Edward is descendant of the first marriage). That just leaves the Schultz family and I do have cousins who will take over that material at some

point in the future. I will continue the Newsletter for a bit perhaps going to just a couple of pages to keep up on the DNA study or any interesting information that I come across. The next two issues to complete this volume will look at the other two daughters.

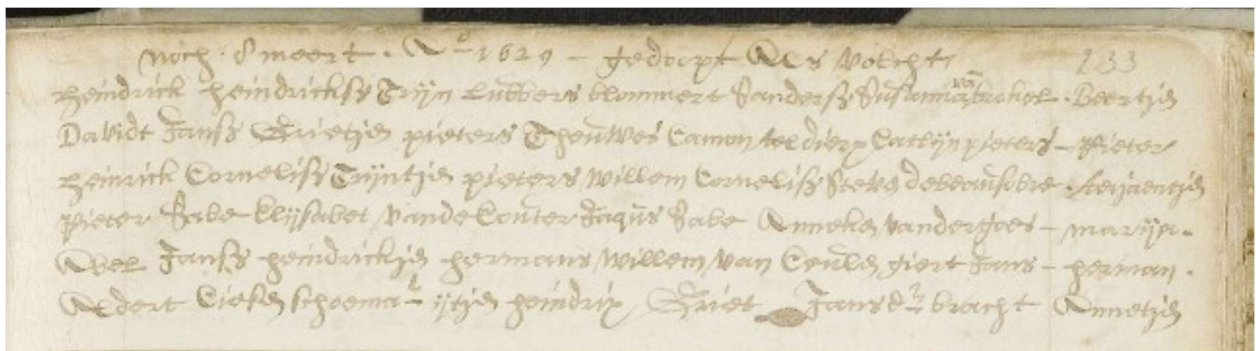

Beertjen Kip was baptized 8 Mar 1629 in the Oude Kerk in Amsterdam, North Holland, The Netherlands. DTB 006p233

Eldest daughter: Beertjen Kip married Jan Janszen Wanshaer Van St Obyn 17 Jan 1649 in New Amsterdam, New Netherlands.

## 7. yDNA study at FT DNA on the Kip-Kipp Families

I submitted a request to see if there is sufficient sample to run a Y-700 sample on Edward's kit. There may or may not be was the answer and I have ordered a Y-700 on his sample. He has tested at many sites and particularly Living DNA was able to take his line back to R-Z326. However, the Y-700 provides more information. Edward tested to R-L48 at FT DNA and the path to R-Z326 is as follows: R-L48 to R-Z9 to R-Z331 at which point the choice between R-Z330 and R-FGC49702 and his line is R-Z330 which takes him to R-Z326

Looking at the 1 – New Amsterdam Kipp members and all six members can be placed in the Kip family tree of New Amsterdam (four of them can actually trace their line back to Hendrick Hendricksen Kip).

Last issue I did mention autosomal matches and I have continued to look at Ancestry.com in that regard. In total Edward has 58 matches with individuals using the Kip spelling in their trees and matching as 5<sup>th</sup> – 8<sup>th</sup> cousins. These are interesting to look at because he is unable to find the parents of his 2x great grandfather Isaac Kipp born 1 Nov 1764 possibly in New York State perhaps in the area of Northeast Town but only because he is there on the 1790 census (26 years later). He married Hannah Meed who was born 11 Aug 1770 in New York State likely daughter of Jonathan Meed the Cooper III. They are living next door or with Jonathan on the 1790 census at Northeast Town. Although certainly anyone who is a 4<sup>th</sup> cousin or greater is of interest. He also has 24 fourth to sixth cousins matching who have the surname Kip in their family tree. A further 3 2<sup>nd</sup>-3<sup>rd</sup> cousins complete the list of matches with the Kip surname in their family tree. Looking at the Kipp spelling there are 10 2<sup>nd</sup> to 3<sup>rd</sup> cousins, 43 4<sup>th</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> cousins and 79 5<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> cousins.

Looking at the Kip spelling, all but four of the individuals matching between 2<sup>nd</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> cousin are sharing a common ancestor and Edward's tree only goes back to Isaac Kipp and Hannah Meed online. Looking at these four individuals that match but do not show a common ancestor, the first one is descendant of Isaac Kipp and Hannah Meed. The second individual traces back to Jacob Kip and Rachel Swartwoud[t] with Jacob being a son of Isaac Hendricksen Kip and a grandson of Hendrick Hendricksen Kip. The match (M.W.) is interesting as it is 28 cM over 2 segments. A number of the ancestors of this individual have come from Ireland in the early 1800s to the United States increasing the significance of the match given that Edward's ancestors moved to Canada between 1800 and 1830 from the United States. Another section of this tree traces back to Austria and Edward does not have any ancestry coming out of this area (he is mostly Northern Europe) with the Kip line linking

back through the Vredenburg family and Catalyntje Kip marrying Willem Van Vredenburg. This couple was located in the Kingston area of Ulster, New York. A third match (D.T.) is also descendant of this same Jacobus Kip and Rachel Swartwout line sharing 23 cM across 1 segment. The fourth match (A.W.) also is a shared match with the second individual above tracing down from the Vredenburg family with Catalyntje Kip marrying William Van Vredenburg. This match is 22 cM across 1 segment. All three of these matches are significant in that I do not see where Edward would be matching in any of the other lines. Having two of them match Edward and each other is very interesting. Looking at Isaac Hendricksen Kip and Catalyntje Hendricks Snyers who married 8 Feb 1653 at New Amsterdam and they had seven children – six sons. There are many Isaac lines descendant of these seven sons and not all of them have been traced down. These three individuals are new since Edward passed away and I have only just seen them for the first time. I will try to spend some time on their trees over the next couple of months but I also want to look at the 5<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> cousins. I did select only matches on the paternal side when I started this process at Ancestry. I do find it somewhat interesting that the shared in common individuals by match 2 and match 4 above included 2 of these 3 2<sup>nd</sup>-3<sup>rd</sup> cousins. A more complete study would perhaps show more matches and I will produce that for the next newsletter. But these are significant matches considering that Catalynte Kip would be a first cousin five times removed to Edward. Edward would be sixth cousin to the tester which fits the selected relationship of 4<sup>th</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> cousin. AncestryDNA does use a piece of software called “TIMBER” which can reduce the size of the match which one must also keep in mind as the match may be larger than as seen.
